Mike Panek expressed the strong desire to have the June 28th Annual Meeting on site. The

Board discussed at length what accommodations might be considered to enable this to

Those accommodations included social distancing, requiring face masks, tents to allow additional seating outdoors, holding the meeting outside, and marking off seating to enable social distancing. Some Board members stated they would not be attending. Mike and Phil will research all possibilities, and will meet Saturday at 10 AM at Hall. Several BOD members stated that they would not attend

6. Correspondence:

- Mike has received many email addresses as part of our request via the Annual Newsletter.
- Kim Howlett 124 LakeView Dr. created a Facebook page for Lake Chaffee which she asked if it could be posted on the Lake Chaffee website. Upon review, it appears to have 75 followers. During the discussion it was decided that the FB page is not an official LCIA organ, under direct control of the LCIA BOD. In which case it would be inadvisable to include it on the website, but we will encourage Lake residents to refer to it.
- Laura asked about graffiti on the back of the clubhouse, Gerry will investigate. Mike will try to match paint color and purchase paint to cover it.
- Irwin Krieger emailed that his unlocked car was gone through, and again wanted to remind residents to lock your cars and sheds.
- Marilyn Rossi (24 Old Town Rd) inquired about not receiving a tax bill since 2016. Laura Rathbun is investigating. Board had discussions and agreed with the answer provided via email, and welcomes her to the Annual meeting for further discussion.
- Received an email with high resolution photos from Laura Rathbun concerning an incident involving an ATV and Golf Cart being driven on LCIA roads by adolescents or children.
 Discussion raised the possibility that Gerry had also spoken with the occupants of the golf cart as well. Mike wrote a letter to the owner of the vehicles. There has been no sighting since. LCIA will monitor this situation.
- Report of trash in the front yard of 149 Lakeview was received. Tom will investigate and talk to the new homeowner. It was also discussed that a home on Deerfield was also unkempt, with trash and high grass. Tom will also investigate.

7. Chairperson's Reports:

<u>Boat Launch & Boat Dock</u> (Gerry Dufresne) Ralph Graziano asked about a replacement for the dock at the cove. It was noted that funds have been allocated for materials, and Gerry mentioned that he had pressure treated materials that he would donate for construction. Mike will measure, make a plan, and calculate cost. We will then try to have a work party to install a new dock.

Gerry installed orange pins to keep people off the wet area on the grass. He also mowed the launch.

<u>Constable</u> (Gerry Dufresne) He did a wellness check on Union Drive after a neighbor called about lights on at a home with no movement in several days. The resident eventually returned, all was okay.

<u>Beaches – Main & Mothers</u> (JeanPanek) Main and Mothers Beaches were opened for Memorial Day, and remain open. Signs were posted per the request of the Board. The rope buoys were installed, raft put out, and clean up of old dock and trash at Mothers Beach.

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"Thank you" to Bobby and Tony, Tom, and Gerry for their efforts. Grass has been cut; sand rototilled. Per the Board, no portable toilets ordered.

<u>Dam</u> (Kari Olson) Not Present

Environment (Ralph Sherman) The Geese have returned in full force; over 30 spotted; including two families with at least four goslings each. Ralph will attempt to have the UConn study and Powerpoint slides put on the website. There was a discussion regarding whether the funds appropriated by the LCIA BOD for expenses (such as testing)would be needed. Ralph will follow up.

Water sampling will be started in the next couple of weeks.

<u>Fund Raising</u> (Phil Silverstein) No current plans due to Covid 19. Phil raised the possibility of an event in the Fall is entirely dependent on how State of Connecticut guidelines/restrictions evolve.

<u>Hall</u> (Kathy Little) Mike installed the smoke detectors (four in total). Questions on why the electric bill spiked the past month will be investigated by Kathy.

<u>Roads</u> Mike Pipe trench on Armitage CT was finally patched. And some pot holes were fixed with tar. Investigating a pot hole on Pine Hill Dr. for repair. Kathy asked about roadside tree trimming, Mike will call Greg Peck for a quote.

<u>Tax Collections</u> Tom is handling State reporting due July 1st, requesting an extension as our annual cycle differs from the Town's.

<u>Website</u> Ralph has been working with Jacqueline to get changes made. Ralph is waiting for Jacqueline to prep the site for his involvement. It does appear – based on several indicators - that Jacqueline has moved, possibly out of state. The Board discussed how best to move forward with re-establishing LCIA control of the site.
