3. Remarks by the President:

 LCIA Board Positions available – Marty gave a briefing regarding the purpose for today's meeting (Election of Officers and Board Members); and the procedure to be followed:

 Officers of the Board (Pres, VP, Treasurer, Secretary) are elected for 1-year terms.

 There are six Regular Members of the BOD, each of whom are elected to 3-year terms.

• There are three Alternate members, who are elected to 1-year terms.

Alternates attend every meeting and if there are not enough Regular

Members for a quorum, Alternate(s) would stand up and take that individuals place for that one meeting.

 • Committee Chairpersons (such as Beach Committee, Hall Committee, Fundraising, Roads, etc.) are appointed by the Board, and are not elected.

The Chairperson and/or the Committee's do not need to do the physical work but keep your eyes and ears open and report to the Board on a monthly

43 basis. As an example, the Roads, LCIA works with a contractor to repair them. 44 45 Roads - keep track of the roads around the community and report back on a monthly basis to the Board. 46 Beaches – need maintenance and care, some clean up, raking in the 47 48 spring/fall and checking on the conditions of the beaches. Dam – There are strict standards to be met per State requirements.
